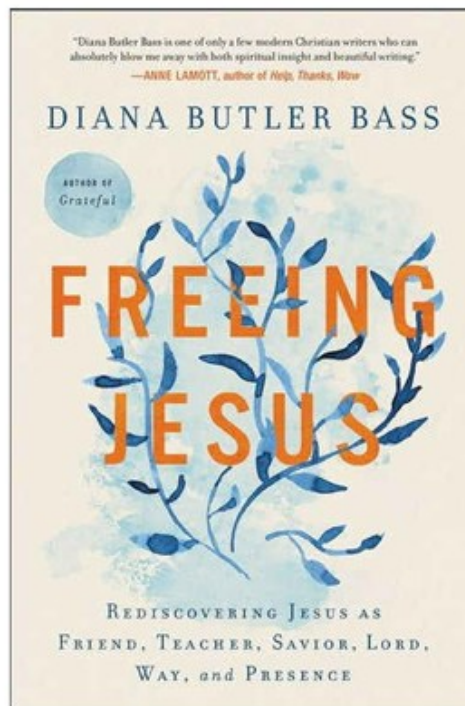
Youth Curriculum: God With Us: Experiencing God's Presence in Our Lives

May's book is *The Talk* by Darrin Bell and *The Talk* by Alicia Williams

They both are Nurturing for Community books in the 2026 Women in Faith reading program.

The Talk by Darrin Bell. When Darrin Bell was six years old, his mother had “The Talk” with him, telling him he couldn’t have a realistic water gun. She said she feared for his safety, explaining that police tend to think of little Black boys as older and less innocent than they really are. With poignant humor, this book examines how The Talk shapes intimate and public moments from childhood to adulthood. Drawing attention to the brutal murders of African Americans and showcasing revealing insights and cartoons along the way. Bell brings readers to the moment of reckoning when people took to the streets protesting the murders of George Floyd and Breonna Taylor

The Talk by Alicia Williams is a children’s book on the same topic about racism and the criminalization of children of color, especially black children. It invites readers of all ages to journey alongside Jay, a little boy growing quickly into a bigger boy, and his loving family. This story is told in an age-appropriate fashion and provides space for parents to insert their discussions with the children to accompany prompting illustrations. ***The Talk*** is a gently honest and sensitive starting point for this far-too-necessary conversation.

June's book is *Red, White and Whole* by Rajani Larocca

Red, White and Whole is a youth book that counts as Spiritual Growth for the 2026 United Women in Faith Reading Program.

This Newbery Honor book is a hopeful novel in verse about an Indian American girl whose life is turned upside down when her mother is diagnosed with leukemia. Reha feels torn between two worlds: school, where she is the only Indian American student and home, with her family’s traditions and holidays. But Reha’s parents do not understand why she’s conflicted—they only notice when Reha does not meet their strict expectations. Then Reha finds out that her Amma is sick. Really sick. Reha, who dreams of becoming a doctor even though she cannot stomach the sight of blood, becomes determined to make her Amma well again. She will be the “perfect Daughter” if it means saving Amma’s life.

July's book is *The Personal Librarian* by Marie Benedict and Victoria Christopher Murra

The Personal Librarian is a Nurturing for Community book in the 2026 reading list and will count on your 2027 Reading Program form if you read the book this month. The 2026/2027 Reading program begins in July.

Named a Best Book of the Year by NPR and a Good Morning America, Book Club Pick, this historical novel explores the life of J.P. Morgan’s personal librarian, Belle da Costa Greene, a black American forced to hide her true identity and pass as White. In her twenties, Belle was hired by J.P. Morgan to curate a collection of rare manuscripts, books, and artwork for his newly built Piermont Morgan Library. She became a fixture in New York City society and one of the most powerful people in the art and book world. But Belle has a secret—she is the daughter of Richard Greener, the first black graduate of Harvard and a well-known advocate for equality.

Reading Program

UW Faith 2025—2026

The 2025/2026 Reading Program ends June 30th, so you have two more months to finish the reading plan you are going to accomplish.

Reminder: For anyone who achieves reading one of the plans, and their name is submitted to me by the end of August, they will have a chance to win a United Women in Faith book for their unit at our district annual meeting.

The 4 Reading Plans:

- Plan 1 5 books per year one from each category
- Plan 2 10 books per year two from each category
- Plan 3 15 books per year two from each category, plus 5 additional books
- Plan 4 20 books per year, two from each category, plus 10 additional books

Even if you haven't started reading there is still time to be a plan I reader. All you have to do is read five books from the united Women in Faith Reading program lists, one for each of the mission emphases:

- Education for Mission
- Leadership Development
- Nurturing for Community
- Social Action
- Spiritual Growth

Each plan includes books from all current reading program lists from the past 5 years, not previously reported. Listening to the books on audio and children and youth books count. To see reading list and to get a form to record the books you read go to uwfaith.org/read.

Other ways to receive reading program reporting credits:

- Listening to two podcasts of Faith Talks counts as spiritual growth.
- Listening to two podcasts of Voices from the Field counts as Education for Mission.
- Reading the 6 issues of Response magazine counts as Nurturing for Community.
- Attending a Mission U study counts as 2 for Spiritual Growth.
- Watching a movie made from one of the books on the list counts for the same mission emphases as the book.
